- Endangered Species Act consultation between USACE and USFWS during review of Master Manual
- 2002 NRC Report "The Missouri River Ecosystem: Exploring the Prospects for Recovery"
- USACE's 2003 Biological Assessment for Master Manual
- USFWS's 2003 Amended Biological Opinion
- USACE's 2004 Record of Decision on revised Master Manual

Initial Vision for MRRIC

- Provide basin-wide forum for collaboration on recovery activities
- Ensure consideration of public values in recovery decisions
- Participation by broad range of basin tribes, states, stakeholders, and federal agencies
- Provide consensus-based recommendations to management entities in the basin
- Play critical role in Adaptive Management

MRRIC Charter Development Process

- April 2006: MRRIC Situation Assessment
- MRRIC Federal Working Group proposes "Framework for Establishing MRRIC"
- Four ways to participate in developing MRRIC Charter: Drafting Team, Review Panel (together comprising MRRIC Planning Group), Public Workshops, Public Comment
- Recruit, appoint and select members of MRRIC Planning Group
- Spring 2007: MRRIC Planning Group convenes to develop recommended Charter for MRRIC

Drafting Team and Review Panel

- Drafting Team works collaboratively to develop consensus recommendation on Charter for MRRIC
- Review Panel provides feedback to Drafting Team on preliminary draft version of Charter





Preamble

MRRIC will strive to provide an essential collaborative forum for the basin to come together and participate in developing a shared vision and comprehensive plan for Missouri River recovery and then to help guide the prioritization, implementation, monitoring, evaluation, and adaptation of recovery actions.

Purpose and Scope

- Provide recommendations and guidance
- Recommendations will
 - Ensure local stakeholder interests are recognized
 - Identify impacts
 - Benefit multiple uses
 - Avoid, minimize and/or mitigate adverse impacts
- Safeguards federal requirements for tribal consultation, trust responsibilities, and treaty rights

Convening Authority

Anticipate to be convened under the authority of Water Resources Development Act of 2007 (pending final approval)

Definitions and Charter Amendment

 - Only make recommendations where there is consensus
 - Federal agencies do not participate in consensus
 - "Consensus" means all members can support or live with action or recommendation
